HOUSING REFERRALS

• Virginia Supportive Housing

- The vast majority of those served are people experiencing <u>chronic</u> homelessness, but they also work with a small population of individuals who have suffered traumatic brain injuries and people living with HIV or AIDS. CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES AND AGENCIES

• Child Protective Services

- Documents, assesses and investigates reports of alleged child abuse and/or neglect. In order for Child Protective Services to accept and respond to a report, it must be considered valid in all four of the following validity criteria: The alleged victim child or children are under the age of 18 at the time of the complaint/report, the alleged abuser must be a caretaker of the child; and, the circumstances/complaint alleges child abuse and/or neglect as defined in the Code of Virginia and in guidance established by the Virginia Department of Social Services. Child Protective Services strives to provide children with a stable and safe home environment. When possible, staff will work to preserve the family by enhancing the parent's ability to provide care for their child and reducing the risk of future abuse or neglect. A full range of services is available to families involved with Child Protective Services including referrals for parenting education, substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment, counseling, medical assistance, financial assistance, budgeting, housing assistance and mentoring programs.
